With its magnificent forested volcanoes, iconic terraced rice fields, teeming coral reefs, and ubiquitous temples, Bali earns its nickname as the "Island of the Gods." While its ancient Hindu culture continues to thrive, Bali is also a hotbed of impact entrepreneurship. This blend of tradition and innovation offers profound lessons for addressing today's global challenges. Students will deepen their understanding of social and environmental issues within the context of a developing economy, while gaining perspective on how social entrepreneurship can be an effective, sustainable approach to addressing problems.

Excursions & Group Activities

Plans may change due to unexpected events and/or new opportunities. Cultural immersion and social events planned for this program may include:

- Immersive, hands-on case studies in Balinese communities
- Site visits to social enterprises and high-impact nonprofits
- Snorkel over an internationallyrenowned coral reef restoration project

Eligibility & Prerequisites

This program is open to all undergraduate interested students. All students admitted to the program must meet with the program leader, Bruce Manciagli (bmanciagli@fsu.edu), before paying the commitment fee. There will be an online component to this program before going abroad.

Itinerary Overview

Day 1: Airport pickup; welcome dinner (*Homestay*)

Days 2-8: Cultural immersion in Ubud, the "cultural center" of Bali (rice fields walk, hands-on cultural workshop, art museum, examples of community leadership, temple visit, dinner and palace performance with the Prince...) Site visits to compelling examples of social enterprises, high-impact nonprofits, and impact-driven businesses as well as the award-winning Green School (Homestay)

Days 9-12: Immersive SIE case study with Pemuteran's innovative & internationally-recognized coral reef restoration project; study this example of collective impact, community-driven conservation & development initiative through engagement with community stakeholders and snorkeling both the BioRock Reef and a spectacular intact reef off of Menjangan Island (Inn)

Days 13-14: Meet Bali Changemaker Fellows in Singaraja; begin Changemakers Summit and Social Innovation Sprint in collaboration with Fellows (*Inn*)

Days 15-17: Immersive SIE case study in a rural village on the slopes of Mount Batur with award-winning social enterprise, East Bali Cashews (*Bungalows with Cots*)

Days 18-20: Complete Changemakers Summit and Social Innovation Sprint (*Inn*)

Days 21-23: Rest & relaxation in Amed; sunrise boat ride & snorkeling over shipwreck (*Eco-Hotel*)

Days 24-28: Sanur Beach; visit to local social enterprise accelerator; complete final assignments; synthesis and reflection; free time (or opportunity to visit additional high-impact organizations); farewell dinner (Hotel/Inn)

Day 29: Head to airport
